





"If you had a patient in need of a dentist, to which dentist would you refer him?"

This is the question topDentists asks thousands of dentists to help them determine who the topDentists should be. Dentists and specialists are asked to take into consideration years of experience, continuing education, manner with patients, use of new techniques and technologies and, of course, physical results.

The nomination pool of dentists consists of dentists listed online with the American Dental Association, as well as dentists listed online with their local dental societies, thus allowing virtually every dentist the opportunity to participate. Dentists are also given the opportunity to nominate other dentists that they feel should be included in our list. Respondents are asked to put aside any personal bias or political motivations and to use only their knowledge of their peer's work when evaluating the other nominees.

Voters are asked to individually evaluate the practitioners on their ballot with whose work they are familiar. Once the balloting is completed, the scores are compiled and then averaged. The numerical average required for inclusion varies depending on the average for all the nominees within the specialty and the geographic area. Borderline cases are given careful consideration by the editors. Voting characteristics and comments are taken into consideration while making decisions. Past awards a dentist has received, status in various dental academies (Academy of General Dentistry, American Academy of Periodontology, etc.) can play a factor in the decision.

Once the decisions have been finalized, the included dentists are checked against state dental boards for disciplinary actions to make sure they have an active license and are in good standing with the board. Then letters of congratulations are sent to all the listed dentists.

Of course, there are many fine dentists who are not included in this representative list. It is intended as a sampling of the great body of talent in the field of dentistry in the United States. A dentist's inclusion in this list is based on the subjective judgments of his or her fellow dentists. While it is true that the lists may at times disproportionately reward visibility or popularity, topDentists remains confident that their polling methodology largely corrects for any biases and that these lists continue to represent the most reliable, accurate, and useful list of dentists available anywhere.

TAKING PAINS HOW DENTISTS ARE FIGHTING THE OPIOID CRISIS

A 2011 study published in the Journal of the American Medical Association analyzed 79.5 million opioid painkiller prescriptions written in the U.S. in 2009. Of those, dentists accounted for eight percent of the total prescribers, but wrote the most opioid prescriptions to patients aged 10 to 19 years, more than 30 percent.

Dentists routinely perform work, such as wisdom tooth removal, that calls for some type of pain relief. But work is being done to combat the problem of over-prescribing.

"Patients don't become addicted to opioids [such as hydrocodone or oxycodone] in a few days. It is long term use that causes addiction. Fortunately, most mouth surgery pain only lasts a few days," says Dr. Clive Rayner of Oral Facial Surgery of Orange Park. "The most important aspect of avoiding opioid problems is the education of the patient in managing

pain with non-narcotic medications and self-care."

The American Dental Association (ADA) adopted guidelines in October 2016 which urge dentists to "conduct a medical and dental history to determine current medications, potential drug interactions and history of substance abuse," and to "consider nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory analgesics [NSAIDs, such as aspirin and ibuprofen] as the first-line therapy for acute pain management."

"Fortunately, opioids are not usually necessary for most common oral surgery procedures," says Rayner. "NSAIDs or non-narcotics are the first line pain medications we prescribe. We prescribe narcotics when nothing else is working, and only enough for two to three days. Other first line management of mouth surgery pain are simple things like ice packs, mouth rinses and numbing gels." * -JOCELYN TOLBERT

There seems to be very mixed reviews on xylitol (zy-li-tall), It's sometimes referred to as rat poison that causes diarrhea and other times praised as being a low-calorie substitute for sugar that strengthens your teeth. So which is true?

The carbohydrate is found in fruits, vegetables, plants and even the human body, although in small amounts. It is said to resemble sugar in both look and taste, but have fewer calories, prevent cavities and reduce the buildup of plaque. With these qualities xylitol is a natural choice for inclusion in gum, toothpaste, candy and syrup.

The American Dental Association says while there is evidence that xylitol causes less damage than sugar there is no conclusive proof that it does, in fact, improve the quality of teeth

As far as its being poisonous? "I haven't heard anything that would suggest it's bad for you," says Dr. Richard Caven, DMD. "You could find studies that say that about broccoli."

It does come with potential side effects, though, including bloating, diarrhea and laxative effects. It can also cause hypoglycemia and liver failure in dogs-so, if you have any, store it away with the chocolate, out of your furry friend's reach.

In the end dentists tell us the best way to prevent cavities and have strong teeth: Brush every day, twice a day, floss once a day, and eat less sugar. But you've probably heard all of that before. * -EMILY BAILEY



Malocclusion, also known as bad bite, is a problem in the way the upper and lower teeth fit together. The condition may also be referred to as an irregular bite, crossbite or overbite.

"It is common. It's just the way your jaws develop," says Dr. Shreena Patel of Beaches Orthodontics. "I'd say about 70 percent of people have some sort of malocclusion."

Patel suggests that a child visit the orthodontist by age 7 or 8 if bad bite is suspected. Prevention by correcting your bite early is the best option. Left unchecked, malocclusion can lead to more problems, such as:

- Tooth pain. A bite that is off by a fraction of a millimeter can cause tooth pain. Tooth pain from these factors usually happens quickly and is usually the result of trauma or dental work.
- Jaw-joint (TMJ) pain. "If the bite's not in the right place, it can lead to TMJ," Patel says. "Some people can have a hard time chewing." If you have a hard

time opening your jaw, can't open it at all or have significant pain during jaw movement, you should be evaluated for TMJ problems.

- Muscular pain. Muscular pain is the most common finding in people with jaw-joint problems and is largely responsible for the pain associated with many headaches.
- Tooth wear. Like tires, teeth can wear down, exposing their sensitive insides. Once tooth wear progresses to a certain point, significant dental work and orthodontics are necessary to correct the problem. Preventing significant tooth wear before it happens is the best approach.
- Gum wear. "Small jaws are related to sleep apnea—when you sleep, [the jaw] drops back," says Patel. People with sleep apnea stop breathing repeatedly in their sleep, leaving the brain without enough oxygen. This can lead to high blood pressure, stroke and heart failure. *



Crooked or crowded teeth, as well as overbites and underbites, may lead to tooth decay, gum disease, and even tooth loss. Braces can improve a patient's overall oral health for a lifetime, and can even help with speech impediments. Choosing an orthodontist is an important decision, so we sought some advice on finding the right one from local pros.

Get recommendations from your dentist, family and friends: Verify that recommendations are orthodontic specialists and not general dentists performing orthodontic treatment. Check out the practice's website and reviews, too.

Meet with the orthodontist for a consultation: "One mistake I sometimes see is when a patient decides on an orthodontic appliance or type of treatment before consulting the orthodontist. Patients can fall into a trap of deciding how they want their treatment to go without soliciting an expert opinion," says Dr. John Lazarra of Lazarra Orthodontics. Make sure you and your orthodontist have the same treatment goals from the beginning so that neither party gets to the end and is unsatisfied with the result. Once his hands are in your mouth, it's hard to discuss options.

Make sure prices are clear: On average, kids, teens and adult braces cost anywhere between \$3,800 and \$8,000 depending on individual cases. It's best to review associated costs and discuss insurance coverage up-front. If necessary, ask about payment options. "There are a lot of different factors that are put together to determine the cost, the most important of which is each patient's individual dental insurance," says Dr. Jason Rice of Rice Orthodontics. "Our goal is that if a patient is ready for treatment, we can find a way to make it affordable for them."

Trust your instincts: Are you and your child happy at the practice? Is everyone there friendly and pleasant? You'll be spending a fair amount of time in this office-treatments can take place over several years-so make sure you find a place where you are comfortable. * -LENNY COBB
