

FINANCIAL POLICY

Thank you for choosing us as your dental care provider. Please read this entire document, and ask any questions, prior to starting any treatment.

Payment of your dental bill is part of the treatment and is expected at the time of service. You must be prepared to pay your bill, with one of the following methods of payment, prior to starting treatment.

Our office accepts Carecredit, cash, checks (with prior approval), Visa - Mastercard and accepted dental insurance. You may ask our front desk personnel if we accept your insurance. Payment plans and reduced fee-for-service plans are available. Please ask anyone in the office.

Regarding Dental Insurances

Please check with your insurance carrier to determine what benefits are allowed or “covered”. Our office can only give estimates about your insurance coverage since it is **your** policy. Insurance companies do not allow us to have access to the policy you have purchased even if we participate with them. We accept, (participate with), most dental insurances plans, and accept what they have determined to be usual, customary, and reasonable fees. We do all the paperwork to submit any claim to your insurance company on your behalf. We work very hard to insure you get the maximum benefit you are entitled to. Be aware you are ultimately responsible for your dental bill no matter what insurance coverage you have.

Usual, customary, and reasonable rates, (UCR's) is a term the insurance company uses to arbitrarily determine what they pay our office for specific procedures. If we accept the insurance companies rates, you may still owe a co-pay or a percentage of the unpaid balance your carrier does not cover. We will always try and inform you of all fees and money you will owe, that we are aware of, before we start any procedure. You should ask your carrier about anything you are not sure of before you accept any treatment.

Minor (underage) patients

Adults are 18 years or over and are responsible for their dental bills. Minors, (under 18 years old), will not be treated unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. That person will become responsible for the minor's dental bill, at the time of treatment, unless other arrangements have been made.
