Summit Surgicare Post Procedure Instructions

General Instructions:

- 1. Begin with liquids and light foods (teas, jello, soup) and progress to your normal diet if you are not nauseated.
- 2. In case of nausea, avoid all food and call your doctor.
- 3. No alcoholic beverages for 24 hours.

Activity:

- 1. Do not make important personal or business decisions or sign legal documents for 24 hours.
- 2. Do not drive or operate hazardous machinery for 24 hours.
- 3. Limit your activities for 24 hours. Do not engage in sports, heavy work or heavy lifting today.
- 4. May resume normal activity.

Pain or discomfort:

- 1. If you experience abdominal pain, nausea, fever, abdominal swelling, cramps, vomiting or bleeding, contact your doctor immediately and avoid solid food.
- 2. To assist in passing flatus after a colonoscopy, it is helpful to lie flat on your left side with knees slightly bent.
- 3. To assist with mild throat discomfort, a soothing throat lozenge is helpful after an upper endoscopy.
- 4. Do not take aspirin or aspirin products without first consulting your doctor.
- 5. Do not take medications without first consulting your doctor.
- 6. Resume normal medications as prescribed by your doctor.
