Lingual Frenectomy (Tongue Tie)



If your newborn is having breastfeeding problems, difficulty latching, noisy feeding and/or poor weight gain, our doctors at Littleton Pediatric Medical Center can assess for a tongue tie.

A tongue tie could cause issues with tongue mobility, which can be a cause of feeding issues or speech issues in the future. If a tongue tie or anykyloglossia is a present, a simple procedure can be done to cut the extra tissue causing the tongue tie. The tongue is gently lifted to expose the frenulum and this is cut gradually during a short visit. There are no nerves in this tissue, so there is very little discomfort. This can help with latching and feeding immediately.
