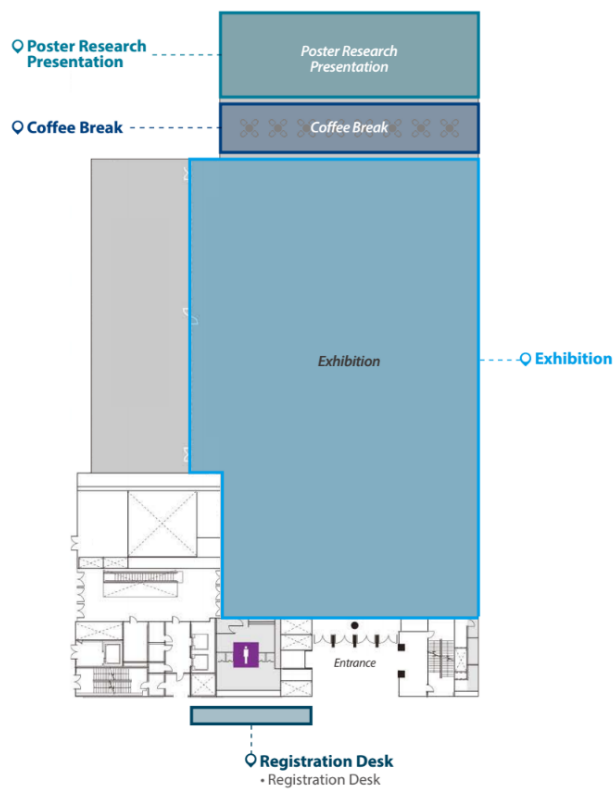
[1] Venue Floor Plan



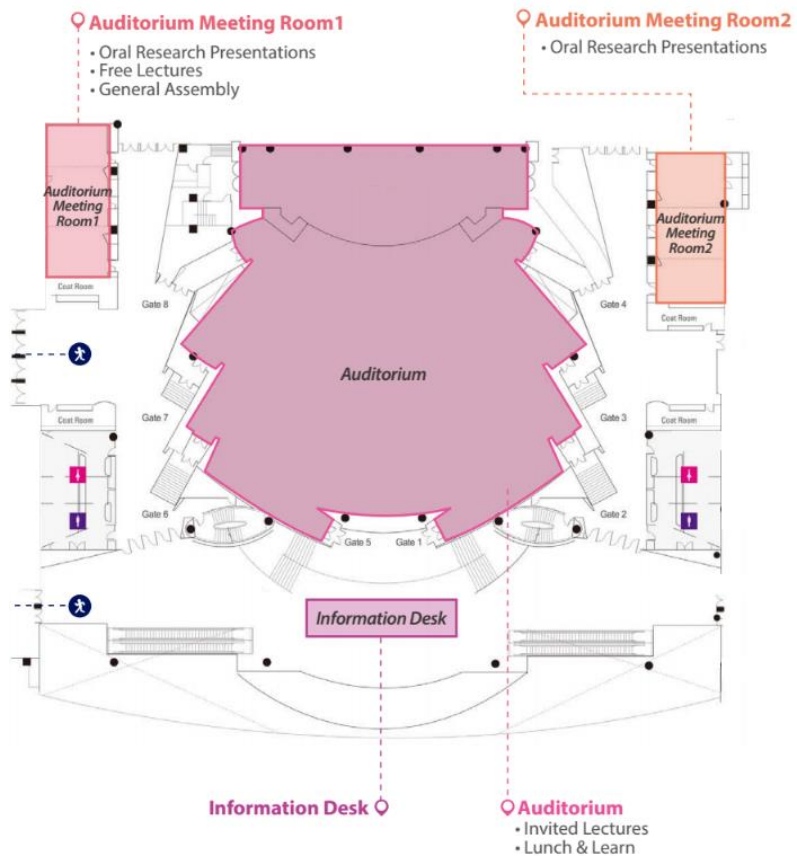
